Greetings CCFRP Volunteers,

Thank you all for making UCSB's first year of collaborative data collection in Southern California a success! As many of you are aware, we conducted 6 sampling trips in our inaugural season, performing hook-and-line surveys both inside and outside of MPAs at the Northern Channel Islands. Across these surveys, volunteers spent 172.24 hours catching and releasing 2,193 fishes (tagging 1,609 individuals) from 28 different species, allowing us to gather important information on species composition, length, and catch rate!
